January – March 2020

Highlights from 2020: CU FAIR's Pandemic Response and Development of the Immigrant Emergency Assistance Fund

- Gov. Pritzker's Stay at Home Order effective March 20th
 - Held Zoom Meeting to Support C-U Immigrants on 4/2 with UUUC's Immigration Task Force with over 40 attendees
- Began to develop partnerships with multiple C-U organizations in response to COVID-19
 Pandemic Response
 - Groceries, medicines, health and sanitation supplies deliveries scheduled
 - Emergency Assistance for Rent, Power and Water Bills
 - Development and distribution with CUPHD and PTA Council of educational materials for COVID-19 in Spanish, French and English
- Started Pandemic Response Action Program to deliver to hundreds of families on a weekly basis
 - Support from donors and volunteers from: CU FAIR, PTA Council, CUPHD, EIFB, CIMIC Food Pantry, Promise Health, Salvation Army, Covenant Fellowship Church, CU MutualAid, CU BetterTogether, Unit 4, Unit 116, and others.
- In parallel to our Pandemic Response Action Program, CU FAIR continued to plan and develop a long-term community partnership to address immigrant needs
 - Immigrant Emergency Assistance Fund
 - Founding members include the Immigration Justice Task Force (UUCUC), Bend the Arc C-U, Three Spinners, CU Immigration Forum and other potential faith-based and community partners

April – June 2020

CU FAIR Pandemic Response to COVID 19 continued

- How We Help Families and Individuals in Crisis
 - Same day deliveries to families in quarantine of groceries, medicines, sanitation supplies and diapers
 - Shadowwood distribution site organized where as many as 175 families receive weekly fresh produce, non-perishables, masks, educational materials, sanitation supplies, and diapers.
 - Information about COVID-19 and how to access healthcare resources, testing and emergency assistance in Spanish, French and English
 - Rental and utilities assistance
 - Average assistance \$700 per family
 - Cooperation with CUPHD and Carle to assist individuals testing positive and/or needing hospitalization


Impact on Families

- Nearly 500 families receiving groceries etc. on a weekly basis
 - More than 1,000 family members helped in April and May
- Hundreds of health kits delivered
- Assistance packages average \$70 per family




Income

CU FAIR Future Activities in FY 2021

- Additional Paid Staff
 - As CU FAIR expands its base of services and outreach to many more families, beyond increased numbers of volunteers it will be important to secure resources for additional paid staff.
 - Volunteer Coordinator(s) with background in volunteer management as well as an immigrant leader with multiple language skills and cultural awareness
 - Office Manager to coordinate the two offices at CUPHD and assist with the Free Store
- CU FAIR Benefit Dinner once large gatherings are safe and a successful end of year donation campaign
- Establishment of a Legal Defense Fund to support asylum cases in partnership with immigrant rights organizations and attorneys
- Branding campaign for the new name of our organization
- Immigrant Aid Concert
 - With the establishment of the "New Normal" for large gatherings and the hope for a COVID-19 vaccine in early 2021 hope springs eternal for a concert in the spring of 2021.
